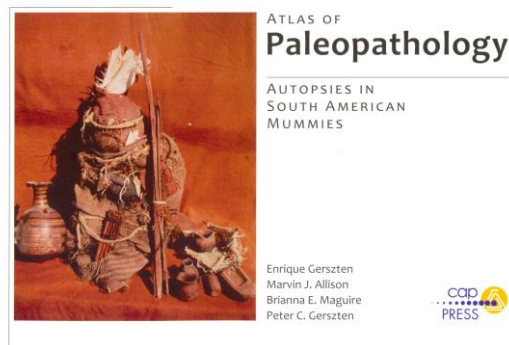
History: X-rays shows a lesion in a 30-year-old female mummy from Northern Chile.
